



Poster Presentation

The poster format can be a suitable way to

- ... illustrate the development and/or findings of your research
 - ... inform about your practical work as a music therapist (e.g., innovative projects, specific challenges, case presentations)
 - ... give insight into your ongoing study
 - ... discuss (new) theoretical concepts
 - ... present your bachelor or master thesis
- in a short and concise form.

At the Nordic Music Therapy Congress in Stockholm we will offer one format option to present your poster:

The classical paper print format, presented on partition walls

- the poster size is 100 centimeters high and 70 centimeters wide

Each poster contribution may also be presented as **oral poster presentation** (duration max. 4 minutes). Please indicate during the submission procedure whether you would like to present your poster also as a brief oral presentation.

Please consider the following **instructions for poster abstract submission**:

- Only abstracts submitted in English will be considered.
- In order to facilitate the review process, please make sure to carefully prepare your abstract using clear and precise language.
- Please use the abstract template provided.
- The title of the abstract should not exceed 18 words.
- The body of the abstract should not exceed 250 words excluding the title, author name(s) and affiliation details, 3-5 keywords and optional bibliography of maximum 5 references.
- Abstracts should use concise subheadings that are appropriate to the presented work (e.g., for empirical research: Background, Methods, Results, and Discussion/Conclusions; for a qualitative case study: Introduction, Methodology, Case presentation, Discussion).
- If abbreviations are used, the abbreviated term should be written out in full the first time it is used.
- If applicable, please provide all details required by any funding and grant-awarding bodies as an Acknowledgement within your abstract, in a separate paragraph, as follows:

For single agency grants: "This work was supported by the [Funding Agency] under Grant [number xxxx]."

For multiple agency grants: "This work was supported by the [Funding Agency 1] under Grant [number xxxx]; [Funding Agency 2] under Grant [number xxxx]; and [Funding Agency 3] under Grant [number xxxx]."

- Please indicate which topic category (music therapy practice, research, theory, or training) is the most appropriate for your submission
