



Roundtable

Roundtable (Informal presentation(s) with organizer(s) engaging all those attending the session in group discussion)

Roundtables offer a platform/forum for discussing current challenges and developments within music therapy. Usually, there will be three to five presenters/speakers participating in a roundtable discussion. A chairperson – responsible for submitting the abstract – will lead the discussion, and coordinate the contributions. The duration of a roundtable is 90 minutes.

Please provide a clear description of the background, the objectives and the content of the roundtable, explaining the role of the individual contributors and the overall goal of the discussion.

Please consider the following **instructions for abstract submission**:

- Only abstracts submitted in English will be considered.
- In order to facilitate the review process, please make sure to carefully prepare your abstract using clear and precise language.
- Please use the abstract template provided.
- The title of the abstract should not exceed 18 words.
- The body of the abstract should not exceed 250 words excluding the title, author name(s) and affiliation details, 3-5 keywords and optional bibliography of maximum 5 references.
- Abstracts should be structured according to the roundtable's content (see description above).
- If abbreviations are used, the abbreviated term should be written out in full the first time it is used.
- If applicable, please provide all details required by any funding and grant-awarding bodies as an Acknowledgement within your abstract, in a separate paragraph, as follows:

For single agency grants: "This work was supported by the [Funding Agency] under Grant [number xxxx]."

For multiple agency grants: "This work was supported by the [Funding Agency 1] under Grant [number xxxx]; [Funding Agency 2] under Grant [number xxxx]; and [Funding Agency 3] under Grant [number xxxx]."

- Please indicate which topic category (music therapy practice, research, theory, or training) is the most appropriate for your submission
