



Workshop

Workshops offer the opportunity to engage in small to medium groups focusing on practical work and exchange around one specific topic. Please provide a clear description of the content, including goals and theoretical framework as well as a structured plan appropriate for a 90-minute workshop. Describe the scope and objective(s) of the workshop, the populations (if relevant) for whom the workshop is intended, and the activities that will take place. Workshops must include a high level of active participation by those attending. Workshop leaders should also provide time for questions and discussion. During submission, please define the maximum number of participants for your workshop.

Please consider the following **instructions for abstract submission**:

- Only abstracts submitted in English will be considered.
- In order to facilitate the review process, please make sure to carefully prepare your abstract using clear and precise language.
- Please use the abstract template provided.
- The title of the abstract should not exceed 18 words.
- The body of the abstract should not exceed 250 words excluding the title, author name(s) and affiliation details, 3-5 keywords and optional bibliography of maximum 5 references.
- Abstracts should be structured according to the workshop's content (e.g., Introduction/Background, Aim(s) and content, Methods/Activities, Conclusions).
- If abbreviations are used, the abbreviated term should be written out in full the first time it is used.
- If applicable, please provide all details required by any funding and grant-awarding bodies as an Acknowledgement within your abstract, in a separate paragraph, as follows:
For single agency grants: "This work was supported by the [Funding Agency] under Grant [number xxxx]."
For multiple agency grants: "This work was supported by the [Funding Agency 1] under Grant [number xxxx]; [Funding Agency 2] under Grant [number xxxx]; and [Funding Agency 3] under Grant [number xxxx]."
- Please indicate which topic category (music therapy practice, research, theory, or training) is the most appropriate for your submission.
